However, we have had to make some major technical changes in our established means of communication. Our updates will now come from "brennaenglefoundation.org" instead of "brennahouse.org". With that being said, many of you have been asking us about how the events in Ukraine have impacted Brenna's Home. The children and housemothers are all doing very well. Everyone is relieved that the corrupt president and his regime are no longer in power. The Ukrainian people desire to live in freedom, in democracy, that is transparent, and free of corruption. That is what the protests were all about. Now the big question is Russia, and to what extent it will go to keep Ukraine within its grasp. Please continue to pray for the nation of Ukraine - that they may experience a new peace after all the turmoil.

Brenna's Home - UKRAINE


As far as impacts to Brenna's Home, during the time of protests, there were some concerns for safety when travelling to and from school, so there were always adults accompanying the younger children. That is no longer necessary. The main impacts for now are financial. Because the previous regime decimated the nation's economy, the value of the currency has dropped considerably, and prices have gotten much more expensive, Valya specifically mentioned the cost of potatoes. This means our costs to support Brenna's Home will rise for the foreseeable future. During the turmoil we also limited our communications both with Brenna's Home and with American friends in Ukraine, because of security issues - most international communications were being monitored by the government.

We last skyped with Brenna's Home on Saturday, March 1. Our new boys, Vanya and Vitalik, are adjusting well, and all the children look great, even though the four girls had recently been sick.

Pavlina (below, left)was able to come for a weekend visit, where there were some Christmas presents waiting for her. After living at Brenna's Home for three years, her older sister took her back to the village two years ago so she could use her to take care of her three children. Pavlina and Yulia are still best buddies. Pavlina told Valya, "If I were a princess and lived in a castle, I would exchange it for the chance to live in Brenna's Home again".



Valya took pictures of the regional government building in Lutsk where protestors removed the regional governor who was part of the corrupt government.



We had two birthdays in February, Zhenya (left) is 9 and Kolya (right) turned 20.



Yulia (below) celebrated her 12th birthday this past Monday. She has been at Brenna's Home for seven years, longer than any other child. Below right is a picture of Yulia with "Mama" Donna when she came to the home just before she turned five.

Brenna's Hope - Ethiopia



Our Ethiopia work has begun!

We are working with Hope Community Services in Northern Ethiopia to provide monthly support for vulnerable high school girls to complete their education. In this region of Ethiopia, many of these girls walk two hours or more EACH WAY to attend high school. This means they face dangers while walking in darkness, and also makes it difficult for them to complete their studies. Consequently they may drop out of school and are frequently used as wives for arranged marriages, even as young as ages 13 to 17. If this happens and they become pregnant, they face challenges with childbirth because their bodies are not fully developed. This may result in a condition known as <u>fistula</u>.

This picture shows the terrain of Tigrai Province where girls walk several hours to get to school.

We originally committed to sponsor 10 high school girls in Tigrai Province, but the need is great, and this a new opportunity that will make a great difference in the lives of these girls. We have set a new goal to sponsor 30 girls. You can make a difference in the lives of these vulnerable young women. Just \$25 a month will provide a shelter and food close to school or transportation services for these girls at great risk. We challenge each of you to make a commitment for one year.
